**MOTION FOR THIRD EXTENSION OF TIME WITHIN WHICH
TO SERVE AND FILE INITIAL BRIEF OF RESPONDENT

Respondent (“the State”), through its undersigned counsel, would respectfully show unto the Court as follows:

I.

The Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter are due to be served and filed on October 11, 2024.

II.

Pursuant to RE: Extension Requests in Criminal Direct Appeals and Post-Conviction Relief Certiorari Proceedings: Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009, the State moves for a **third** extension in the above-referenced criminal appeal and asks for an additional thirty days to complete the brief in this case. In the past few weeks, the undersigned

counsel has filed a Final Brief of Respondent in The State v. Luis and Juan Alvarez (2023-000182 and 2023-001149), a Return to Petition for Writ of Certiorari in Thomas Styla v. State (2024-001369), a Return to Petition for Writ of Certiorari in The State v. Theodore Bolick (2024-001369), an Amended Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter in Ex Parte: SCDMH (Jevon Carter) (2023-001766), a Return to Motion for Bail Pending Appellate Review in Stephanie Greene v. State (2023-001934), a Petition for Writ of Certiorari in The State v. Wanda Crumpton (2019-001246); and has argued a case in the Court of Appeals in The State v. Bradley Corlew (2021-000989).

III.


The undersigned counsel submits this extension request is supported by good cause and is not intended for purposes of delay. The undersigned counsel is currently working on the Brief in this case and intends to have it finished in a timely manner. However, the undersigned counsel has not yet been able to finish the Brief due to a heavy workload. Accordingly, in order to ensure the Brief is properly researched and prepared, I would therefore request an additional extension of time within which to serve and file the Brief.

WHEREFORE, Respondent prays that the Court extend the deadline for the service and filing of the Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter in this case for thirty days from the date such relief is granted; hold the matter in abeyance pending a ruling on Respondent's motion; and grant such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.


