



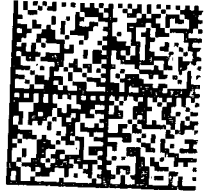

This Matter came before me for a hearing on July 27, 2011 on the Defendant's Motion to Dismiss. The Defendant's motion rests upon the statutory provisions of the South Carolina Tort Claims Act, §15-78-10 et seq., the Notice of Intent to File Suit provisions of S.C. Code Ann. §15-79-125 and its statutory enabling authority within the Noneconomic Damage Awards Act of 2005, 2005 Act No. 32.

In accordance with the following, Judgment is to be entered in favor of the Defendant.

Procedural History

Plaintiff initially brought claims against the Defendant, Clarendon Memorial Hospital, and D. Maxwell Egbonim, M.D. through a Notice of Intent to File Suit, filed on or about September 12, 2008. The allegations of the Notice concerned medical care rendered to Joyce Grubb occurring prior to her transfer from Clarendon Memorial Hospital on September 8, 2006 and her subsequent death at Richland Memorial Hospital on September 14, 2006. In response to this Notice, counsel for the Defendant authored the attached correspondence dated October 13, 2008 outlining a willingness to participate in mediation but refusing to waive any rights pursuant to the Tort Claims Act. (Exhibit #1). Thereafter, no efforts were made to move forth with the proposed mediation conference and admittedly no extensions were sought or granted by the court.

Plaintiff then initiated a Summons and Complaint against the Defendant and D. Maxwell Egbonim, M.D. on August 7, 2009. The Defendant filed a timely Answer and Motion to Dismiss on September 22, 2009.¹

Within its Answer and accompanying Motion to Dismiss, the Defendant asserted various defenses pursuant to the Tort Claims Act, including the two year Statute of Limitations of S.C. Code Ann. §15-78-110, as a verified claim had not been filed within one year in accordance with S.C. Code Ann. §15-78-80 which would allow an extension of the statute of limitations from two (2) to three (3) years.²

I. The Defendant is entitled to Judgment as the Plaintiff failed to meet the Statute of Limitations contained within S.C. Code Ann. §15-78-110.

The statute of limitations as to a governmental health care facility such as the Defendant is found within the Tort Claims Act at S.C. Code Ann. §15-78-110, which provides:

Except as provided for in Section 15-3-40, any action brought pursuant to this chapter is forever barred unless an action is commenced within two years after the date the loss was or should have been discovered; provided, that if the claimant first filed a claim pursuant to this chapter then the action for damages based upon the same occurrence is forever barred unless the action is commenced within three years of the date the loss was or should have been discovered.

Plaintiff acknowledges that the statute began to run at the time of Joyce Grubb's death at Richland Memorial Hospital on September 14, 2006. Thus, the statute would run as of September 14, 2008, unless there was a filing of a verified claim.

The provisions relating to the filing of a verified claim as to a governmental health care facility such as the Defendant are found within S. C. Code Ann. §15-78-80. Specifically, §15-78-80(d) mandates that a claim "must be received within one year after the loss was or should have been discovered." Plaintiff admittedly did not file a verified claim within a year in accordance with

provisions of this Chapter. Given this, the action filed on August 7, 2009, as to the Defendant Clarendon Memorial Hospital, was not commenced within two (2) years of September 14, 2006, and Judgment must be granted the Defendant pursuant to §15-78-100.

II. Plaintiff may not rely upon the Notice of Intent provisions of S.C. Code Ann §15-79-125 to assert a claim as to the Defendant, a governmental health care facility.

The Plaintiff contends that the statute of limitations should be extended to three years as the previously filed Notice of Intent constitutes the institution of an action within the 2 year statute of limitations. This argument, however, fails on several grounds.

It must be noted that the prerequisite of the Notice of Intent provisions were adopted within the South Carolina Noneconomic Damage Awards Act of 2005, 2005 Act No. 32, effective July 1, 2005, for causes arising after that date. There are, however, two statutory provisions which establish that this Act does not affect the rights of the Defendant, a governmental health care facility, under the S.C. Tort Claims Act.

First, S.C. Code Ann. § 15-32-240 of the Noneconomic Damage Awards Act provides:

“The provisions of this article do not affect any right, privilege, or provisions of the South Carolina Tort Claims Act pursuant to Chapter 18, Title 15.....”

Additionally, the legislature concurrently adopted a nearly identical provision within the Tort Claims Act at S.C. Code Ann. §15-78-220:

“The provisions of Act 32 of 2005 do not affect any right, privilege, or provision of the South Carolina Tort Claims Act as contained in Chapter 78, Title 15 of the 1976 Code.....”

Given these, Plaintiff cannot rely upon the provisions of the Notice of Intent to circumvent the S.C. Tort Claims Act and the legislatively mandated “verified claim” requirements found within S.C. Code Ann. §15-78-80, including the statute of limitations contained within S.C. Code Ann. §15-78-110. The Tort Claims Act provides the sole ability through which the Plaintiff can file suit against a governmental health care facility specifying, that the “General Assembly additionally intends to provide for liability on the part of the State, its political subdivisions, and employees

while acting within the scope of official duty, **only to the extent provided herein.**" S. C. Code Ann. §15-78-20(b)(emphasis added). Having failed to first file a verified claim in accordance with the Tort Claims Act within one year or commence an action through the filing of a Summons and Complaint within two years, the Plaintiff failed to commence the action within the statutory mandates applicable to this governmental health care facility. The Notice of Intent provisions found within the South Carolina Noneconomic Damage Awards Act of 2005 do not apply to this governmental health care facility, as the Tort Claims Act governs all such actions, and Judgment must be rendered in Defendant's favor.

III. Alternatively, should the Notice of Intent be deemed to institute an action for damages pursuant to the Tort Claims Act, the Defendant is statutorily precluded pursuant to the statute of limitation provisions of S.C. Code Ann. §15-79-125(E).

The Notice of Intent provisions of S.C. Code Ann. §15-79-125 contains specific requirements concerning the conduct of mediation. Plaintiff counsel asserts that given Defense counsel's letter of October 13, 2008, mediation would have been futile, and therefore, mediation was not conducted with a subsequent decision being made to file the Complaint on August 7, 2009. This argument, however, lacks merit as the Notice of Intent statute vests the circuit court with the jurisdiction to enforce its provisions. S.C. Code Ann. §15-79-125(D). Even though Plaintiff contends mediation would have been futile, the statute does not excuse a case from mediation for this reason.

S. C. Code Ann. §15-79-125(C) specifies that the parties "shall" participate in mediation within ninety (90) and no later than one hundred and twenty (120) days from the service of the Notice.

(C) Within ninety days and no later than one hundred twenty days from the service of the Notice of Intent to File Suit, the parties **shall** participate in a mediation conference unless an extension for no more than sixty days is granted by the court based upon a finding of good cause.

This provision clearly provides the parties an allowance to seek an extension from the court "based upon a finding of good cause." In this matter, however, no such extension or relief was sought from the court by the parties. Rather, there was a delay until August 7, 2009, approximately three hundred and twenty-eight (328) days, with no additional action to enforce the provisions of the mediation conference pursuant to the court's jurisdiction under S.C. Code Ann §15-79-125 or the Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR) Rules. Absent mediation of the case, as offered by the Defendant, and absent an extension to mediate, the statute of limitations resumed running following the one hundred and twenty (120) day allowance to conduct mediation, and this case must be dismissed.

The Notice of Intent legislation specifically contemplates the statute of limitations as it provides:

(E) If the matter cannot be resolved through mediation, the plaintiff may initiate the civil action by filing a summons and complaint pursuant to the South Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure. The action must be filed:

- (1) within sixty days after the mediator determines that the mediation is not viable, that an impasse exists, or that the mediation should end; or
- (2) **prior to expiration of the statute of limitations, whichever is later.**

S.C. Code Ann. §15-79-125(E). (emphasis added).

The Plaintiff initially filed the Notice of Intent on September 12, 2008 or approximately two (2) days prior to the running of the two year statute. This, subject to the mediation requirements of the statute, tolled "all applicable statutes of limitations." §15-79-125 (A). As outlined within Exhibit 1, service was effectuated on September 16, 2008 with mediation then required to be held on or before January 16, 2009. As no mediation or request for extension occurred within one hundred and twenty (120) days or by January 16, the statute of limitations then commenced running in accordance with S.C. Code Ann. §15-79-125 (E)(2). Based on the dates involved in this case, two days remained on the statute of limitations as of January 16, 2009, and no further tolling of the statute of limitations was allowed. The two year statute of limitations contained within S.C. Code Ann. §15-78-110 expired on January 18, 2009 as mediation was not conducted and no sixty (60)

day extension for mediation was obtained. This alternative argument therefore is without merit, and the action must be dismissed.

Conclusion

This Court concludes that the two (2) year statute of limitations of the Tort Claims Act expired without the commencement of an action by the Plaintiff, as there was no verified claim filed in accordance with the one year deadline of the S.C. Tort Claims Act. Additionally, the Noneconomic Damage Awards Act of 2005 cannot be invoked to extend the statute of limitations contained within the S.C. Tort Claims Act.


It is hereby ORDERED that the action is dismissed with prejudice.

Dear John:

As we have discussed, the Clarendon Memorial Hospital is in receipt of your Notice of Intent to File Suit which was served on or about September 16, 2008. Apparently, you have filed the notice pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 15-79-125, a part of the South Carolina Non-Economic Damage Awards Act of 2005. Please note that the Act does not apply to governmental entities subject to the South Carolina Tort Claims Act such as the Clarendon Memorial Hospital which is a governmental healthcare facility. The 2005 Acts specifically includes § 15-32-240 entitled "Rights under other Acts":

The provisions of this article do not affect any right, privilege, or provision of the South Carolina Tort Claims Act pursuant to Chapter 78, Title 15 or the South Carolina Solicitation of Charitable Funds Act as contained in Chapter 56, Title 33.

Thus, the South Carolina Tort Claims Act serves as the exclusive remedy for any action against a governmental entity, and all claims, remedies and procedures are governed by the South Carolina Tort Claims Act rather than the South Carolina Non-Economic Damage Awards Act of 2005.

Participation, if any, in pre-filing discovery is not intended to be, and shall not be, a waiver of the South Carolina Tort Claims Act as its exclusive remedy by the Insurance Reserve Fund or any governmental entity covered by the South Carolina Tort Claims Act. Of course, the Insurance Reserve Fund is not objectionable to an evaluation of your supported claims and has no objection to participating in a mediation conference should you propose this. Our participation in any mediation conference, though, is not intended to be and shall not be a waiver by the Insurance Reserve Fund of the provisions of the South Carolina Tort Claims Act.

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

RE: Interim Guidance Regarding Personal Data Identifiers and
Other Sensitive Information in Appellate Court Filings

ORDER

Under the Federal Constitution, our State Constitution, and our common law, court records are presumptively open to the public, and these records may only be sealed by a court based on specific findings that the need for secrecy outweighs the presumption of openness. Ex parte Capital U-Drive-It, Inc., 369 S.C. 1, 630 S.E.2d 464 (2006); Davis v. Jennings, 304 S.C. 502, 405 S.E.2d 601 (1991). Therefore, with some few exceptions,¹ documents filed with this Court or the South Carolina Court of Appeals (appellate court) are available to the public unless sealed by order of the appellate court in which the matter is pending.

Several commercial vendors have recently requested copies of briefs filed with the appellate courts, and it is anticipated that these and other appellate filings will be available electronically from both private and public sources in the future. The ready availability of these documents raises significant privacy concerns. While this problem is currently under review by the Chief Justice's Task Force on Public Access to Court Records, we adopt the following interim guidance regarding personal data identifiers and other sensitive information in documents filed in the appellate courts.

Parties shall not include, or will partially redact where inclusion is necessary, the following personal data identifiers from documents filed with an appellate court:²

1. Social Security Numbers. If a social security number must be included, only the last four digits of that number should be used.
2. Names of Minor Children. If a minor is the victim of a sexual assault or is involved in an abuse or neglect case, the minor's name will be completely redacted and a term such as "victim" or "child" should be used. In all other cases, only the minor's first name and first initial of the last name (i.e., John S.) should be used.
3. Financial Account Numbers. If financial account numbers are relevant, only the last four digits of these numbers should be used.
4. Home Addresses. If a home address must be included, only the city and state should be used.

Parties wishing to file documents containing the personal data identifiers listed above may file unredacted documents under seal, together with redacted versions for the public file. The sealed unredacted documents shall be filed in a separate Appendix and the bottom of each page of the Appendix shall be marked "Sealed." No order of the appellate court will be required to file this sealed Appendix. The number of copies of the Appendix to be served and filed shall be the same as that required for the brief, record on appeal, motion or other filing that includes the redacted documents.

If the caption of the case contains any of the personal data identifiers listed above, the parties should file a motion to amend the caption to redact the identifier. This should be done contemporaneously with the filing of the notice of appeal or the commencement of the case with the appellate court. Without a motion to the appellate court, the caption of a juvenile delinquency matter from the family court shall be redacted to only use the juvenile's first name and first letter of the juvenile's last name (i.e., In the Interest of John S., a Juvenile.)

A party seeking to seal material beyond those personal identifiers listed above, must file a motion to seal with the appellate court in which the matter is pending. This is true even if the lower court or administrative tribunal may have issued an order sealing the record. Until the motion is ruled on, the clerk of the appellate court shall treat the material as if it is sealed. Parties and counsel are reminded that the standard established in Ex parte Capital U-Drive-It, Inc. and Davis v. Jennings, *supra*, must be met before any request to seal all or a portion of a record will be granted. Once sealed by order of an appellate court, the materials will remain sealed before the appellate courts unless otherwise ordered by the appellate court in which the matter is pending.

Parties should exercise caution in including other sensitive personal data in their filings, such as personal identifying numbers, medical records, employment history, individual financial information, proprietary or trade secret information, information regarding an individual's cooperation with the government, information regarding the victim of any criminal activity, or national security information.

Attorneys are expected to discuss this matter with their clients so that an informed decision can be made about the inclusion of sensitive information. The appellate courts and their staff will not review filings for redaction or to determine if materials should be sealed; the responsibility for insuring that information is redacted or sealed rests with counsel and the parties.
