To Whom It May Concern:

I am requesting that Judge Amy McCullough, not be allowed to preside over this case in the Probate Court, that she NOT be allowed to make any decisions regarding my father's estate due to her unethical conduct as a judge. I request that she be recused or that there be a change in venue. I filed a complaint against Judge McCullough with the office of disciplinary counsel for signing an order to have me involuntarily committed to the VA psychiatric ward for a 24 hour mental evaluation prior to my scheduled protest against her, Judge Belton and the probate court.

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because of the injustices I experienced there concerning my father's estate. I believe it was done to prevent me from protesting, to attempt to get me to give my sister power of attorney over my Affairs and in retaliation of a Complaint filed with the ODC re: Judge Belton & the Probate Court and its practices. I Do not believe she would be unbiased when making her ruling, since I protested outside the courthouse after I was released from the hospital, 21 days NOT 24 hours later, requesting she be disbarred and to stop Probate court in justice. Although, I have forgiven Judge McCullough for putting me through this horrifying experience she must be held accountable for her wrongdoing.

I was assaulted by my uncle that day, a victim of a crime and instead of my uncle being arrested I was committed to a psychiatric ward at the VA, where's the justice in that?
