As you may or may not know, Martin has been in the hospital since November, 11, 2024 due to a foot infection. Good evening. On November 18, the Court sent a deficiency letter to Appellants' counsel advising the motion for an extension of time to file a reply brief required a \$50.00 filing fee. Was the filing fee submitted to the Court within 10 days as stated in the Court's deficiency letter? I do not have a copy of any correspondence enclosing the filing fee but recognize payment may have been sent to the Court without any cover letter.

In addition, inasmuch as Appellants' counsel requested an additional 10 days beyond the original deadline of November 15, the Reply brief would have been due no later than Monday, November 25.
