

Counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and record on appeal in the case of State v. Mykel Johnson on Monday, August 19, 2013. Also on Monday, August 19, 2013 counsel filed the initial reply brief in the case of State v. Julio Angelo Hunsberger. Counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and record on appeal in the case of State v. Brandon Green on Wednesday, August 14, 2013. Also on Wednesday, August 14, 2013 counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Bobby Pyke v. State. On Tuesday, August 13, 2013, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Anthony M. Brown v. State. Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of Stanley Wise v. State on Friday, August 2, 2013. Also on Friday, August 2, 2013 counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and record on appeal in the case of State v. Joseph Wadell Dunbar. Also on Friday, August 2, 2013 counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. Romeo Brown. 
4. As indicated by his consent below, counsel for the state graciously consents to or does not oppose this request.


