ORDER

Petitioner has filed a petition for a writ of certiorari seeking review of the decision of the South Carolina Court of Court of Appeals in *Taylor v. Brooks*, Appellate Case No. 2013-0000803. Petitioner has failed to:

- (1) File an appendix that complies with the requirements of Rule 242(e)(2)-(4) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR);
- (2) Provide a proof of service showing that a copy of the petition for a writ of certiorari and a copy of the appendix have been served on the opposing counsel (or the party if unrepresented by counsel) as required by Rule 242(c) and (e), SCACR; and,¹
- (3) Either pay the filing fee required by Rule 242(c), SCACR, or serve and file with this Court a motion seeking a waiver of that fee. *See Ex parte Martin*, 321 S.C. 533, 471 S.E.2d 134 (1995)(" In the absence of a statutory provision allowing the general waiver of filing fees, we conclude motions to proceed in forma pauperis may only be granted where specifically



authorized by statute or required by constitutional provisions.") and *Martin v. South Carolina Dept. of Corrections*, 350 S.C. 196, 565 S.E.2d 756 (2001) ("[T]he payment plan laid out in [S.C. Code of Laws] sections 24-27-100 and 24-27-150 is not applicable to filing fees incurred at either the Supreme Court or the Court of Appeals.").

Accordingly, the petition for a writ of certiorari is hereby dismissed. If a motion to reinstate is not actually received by this Court within the time specified by Rule 260(a), SCACR, the Court of Appeals may send the remittitur under Rule 221(b), SCACR.
