





ORDER

On December 27, 2024, this court denied Appellant's motion to stay an order granting partial summary judgment. On January 13, 2025, and January 23, 2025, Appellant filed documents titled "motion to stay." These appear to request this court rehear its previously denial of Appellant's motion to stay pursuant to Rule 241(d)(7) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.
