



ORDER

On December 19, 2024, this court dismissed this appeal because Appellant failed to file a designation of matter in compliance with the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.¹ On December 27, 2024, Appellant filed a motion to reinstate his appeal, which we construe as a petition for rehearing. After careful consideration of the petition for rehearing, the Court is unable to discover that any material fact or principle of law has been either overlooked or disregarded, and hence, there is no basis for granting a rehearing. Accordingly, the petition for rehearing is denied.
