## ORDER

---

On January 14, 2025, Respondents moved to exclude certain matters designated by Appellant for the record on appeal. On January 16, 2025, Respondents moved to strike "improper, immaterial, and impertinent arguments" from Appellant's initial brief and moved to extend the time for filing Respondents' initial brief and designation of matter pending this court's ruling on the aforementioned motions. Appellant filed returns to each motion, opposing Respondents' requested relief, and Respondents filed a reply to the returns for the motion to strike and motion to exclude. After careful consideration, we deny Respondents' motion to strike Appellant's brief. Further, we grant in part and deny in part Respondents' motion to exclude matter from Appellant's designation of matter. Specifically, we strike the following matters from Appellant's designation of matter: #9, #16, #18, and #19. However, we deny Respondents' motion to strike as to matter #6 and #20. *See* Rule 209(b), SCACR ("[T]he Designation may only propose to include portions of the transcript, pleadings, orders, exhibits, or other materials which may be properly included in the Record on Appeal [See Rule 210(c)]."); Rule 210(c), SCACR ("The Record shall not, however, include matter which was not presented to the lower court or tribunal."). Within ten days of the date of this order, Appellant shall file and serve an amended designation of matter omitting designated items #9, #16, #18, and #19. Upon receipt of Appellant's amended designation of matter, Respondents shall have thirty days in which to serve and file the initial brief of respondents and designation of matter.
