ORDER

On November 19, 2024, Appellant filed her final brief. On November 25, 2024, this court sent a letter to Appellant explaining her final brief did not comply with Rule 211(b) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules and requiring Appellant correct her final brief within ten days. Appellant then filed a motion to amend her final brief. On January 16, 2025, this court denied Appellant's motion to amend her final brief and ordered Appellant to serve and file a final brief that complied with Rule 211(b) within ten days of the date of the order. We warned Appellant that failure to comply would result in dismissal of this appeal.

On January 24, 2025, Appellant moved for an extension of time to file her final brief, stating she and her family have been affected by the recent fires in California. Respondent sent an email, which we construe as a return, opposing the request for an extension of time. Appellant sent a responsive email, which we construe as a reply, reiterating her request for an extension of time. After careful consideration, we grant Appellant's request for an extension of time. Appellant shall serve and file a final brief that complies with Rule 211(b) within ten days of the date of this order. Failure to comply will result in dismissal of this appeal.

Also, on January 24, 2025, Appellant filed a "motion for clarification," in which she requested this court issue an order "clarifying or changing its January 16, 2025 [o]rder." Respondent filed a return, opposing Appellant's motion for clarification. After careful consideration, we take no action on Appellant's motion for clarification because the motion for clarification asks this court to rehear her motion to amend her final brief, which is improper as our January 16, 2025 order

did not dismiss or finally decide her appeal. *See* Rule 221 (c), SCACR ("The appellate court will not entertain petitions for rehearing on a motion or petition unless the action of the court on the motion or petition has the effect of dismissing or finally deciding a party's appeal.").
