



FINDINGS OF FACT

The issue in this case is whether the claimant voluntarily retired from the most recent bona fide employment.

The claimant appealed the claims adjudicator's determination mailed August 19, 2011, which held the claimant disqualified from receiving benefits effective July 3, 2011, upon a finding the claimant voluntarily retired from employment.

The claimant worked from June 7, 1982, to May 22, 2011, with the subject employer, most recently as a sterile processing technician. The claimant requested a new schedule that would give her one (1) weekend off a month. The employer asserted that they could accommodate the claimant's request. The claimant had been working her current schedule since June of 2009. The claimant's job was not in jeopardy. The claimant could have continued in her current position. Rather than continue working, the claimant decided to retire. The claimant voluntarily retired on May 22, 2011. The claimant's retirement was not mandatory.

REASONS

South Carolina Code provides in §41-35-120(8) for an indefinite disqualification from benefits if a claimant is found to have voluntarily retired from the most recent bona fide employment. The disqualification continues until the claimant returns to work and earns wages equal to at least eight (8) times the weekly benefit amount.

In this case, the claimant's retirement was not mandatory. The claimant elected to retire because the employer would not accommodate her request for a new schedule. The claimant freely submitted her request to retire in writing. A well settled rule of law is that the word "voluntary" means a, choice, election, or decision of a claimant to retire as contrasted with a policy or action of the employer requiring her to retire. Thus, a claimant may involuntary retire so far as she is concerned due to poor health, age, domestic obligations, failure of transportation or other personal reasons. Yet, such a retirement is nevertheless voluntary for the purposes of the law since in terms of employment relationship the termination was brought about by her act and not that of the employer. Therefore, the Tribunal finds the claimant voluntarily retired from her position and an indefinite disqualification must be imposed.

DECISION

The Tribunal finds the claimant disqualified from receiving benefits effective July 3, 2011, until requalification, upon a finding the claimant voluntarily retired from employment. This decision affirms the determination mailed August 19, 2011.

This will be the final decision of the Agency, unless you file an appeal to the Appellate Panel setting forth in detail the grounds for appeal within ten (10) calendar days, including weekends and holidays, from the mailing date of this decision. If the tenth day falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, the appeal period is extended to the next business day. Your appeal may be filed in person at any Workforce Center, or by mail, addressed to "Appellate Panel," Post Office Box 995, Columbia, South Carolina. 29202. For additional information or assistance in filing an appeal, contact your local Workforce Center.

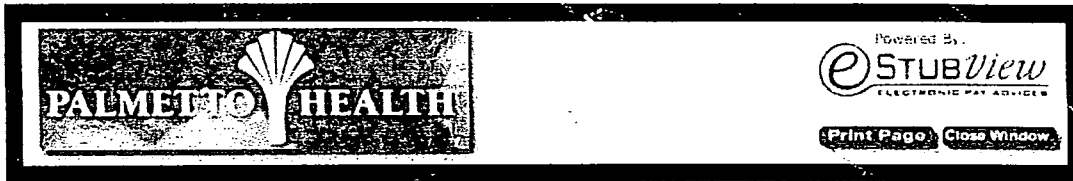
