Pursuant to Court’s Rule 11, 13 and 21, this Petitioner respectfully requests this Court to grant a 60-day extension of time [until April 19, 2025] to file a writ of certiorari— before a full member Court. In fairness to Respondent, this petitioner requests Chief Justice Roberts to excuse himself due to petitioner’s direct communication with him prior to submission of this petition.

This petition is being submitted to appeal the United States District Court for the District of South Carolina decision to revoke informa pauperis status and deny Notice of Removal from South Carolina Court of Appeals [submitted to appeal the Judgement Order for foreclosure and Denial Order to Vacate Judgement from Lexington County Courthouse, issued on November 14,

2024 and January 29, 2025, respectively; halting foreclosure activity until review and disposition of this case (see Appendix A for Motion for Stay). This Court already upheld this petitioner's in forma pauperis status on May 20, 2024. Although this Court permits writs of certiorari to be filed within 90 days, this action is requested due to Respondent issuing a Notice of Acquisition within 60 to 90 days since the issuance of the November 14, 2024 Judgement Order, holding a preliminary sale on February 3, 2025, and scheduling a final sale just 2 days from now, on March 5, 2025. In addition, several motions in associated case No. 23-6591, Tracie Green v US Bank National, remain before this Court.

As discussed in the June 7, 2024, Petition for Rehearing to the Writ of Certiorari to US Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit:

*Although instructed by HUD/FHA, US Bank National Association failed to comply with the latter two steps: determininng the appropriate assistance option, and assisting this Petitioner in completing the selected option... After receiving notice of a Partial Claim Approval and experiencing a concerning telephone encounter with a US Bank National representative, this Petitioner sent the following email to US Bank National Association on October 24, 2021 requesting more information... Again, US Bank National Association failed to comply with HUD/FHA guidelines by not providing the requested assistance. After conducting self-initiated research into Partial Claims Approval, this Petitioner uncovered US Bank National error as this Petitioner indeed did not qualify for the COVID-19 Recovery Standalone Partial Claim, as she was unable to resume making current monthly mortgage payments as specified in HUD 21-115, dated July 23, 2021, Public Release Notice entitled "Federal Housing Administration Announces Additional COVID-19 Recovery Options for Homeowners"...*

*Enlightened, this Petitioner emailed US Bank National Association on November 9, 2021, requesting a COVID-19 Loan Modification... After receiving a request to submit another Mortgage Assistance Application on the same day, this Petitioner emailed US Bank National on February 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> requesting clarification of the need to submit another application and requesting again COVID-19 loan modification due to not qualifying for the partial claim as outlined by the HUD/FHA... Again, US Bank National Association did not respond; that is, until this Petitioner received the March 4, 2022 Foreclosure summons.*

**REASONS FOR GRANTING AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE WRIT OF CERTIORARI TO UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT FOR THE DISTRICT OF SOUTH CAROLINA**

The time to file a Petition for a Writ of Certiorari should be extended for 60 days—until April 19, 2025—to appeal the United States District Court for the District of South Carolina decision to revoke *informa pauperis* status and deny Notice of Removal from South Carolina Court of Appeals [submitted to appeal the Judgement Order for foreclosure and Denial Order to Vacate Judgement from Lexington County Courthouse, issued on November 14, 2024 and January 29, 2025, respectively; halting foreclosure activity until review and disposition of this case being a stay motion is in place. Applicable reasons include the following:

1. It was discovered after appeal to United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit, that the February 3, 2025 preliminary auction of this petitioner's home was not conducted by standard procedure, causing undue harm to petitioner (see Appendix B). Moreover, current posture of the same court appears to be set to repeat the same occurrence is the final auction scheduled for March 5, 2025 (two (2) days from the date of this motion). Moreover, as of March 3, 2025,

**access to the public index has been restricted, preventing Defense and the public access to public court documents.**


2. The appeal to the Appeals Court for the Fourth Circuit is still in progress (Appendix C).
3. There is evidence that US Bank National intended malicious harm from the beginning of its pursuit of foreclosure. As discussed in the multiple court documents, including but not limited to the Writ of Certiorari to US District Court of South Carolina and US Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit; Petition for Rehearing; Supplemental Brief, Stay Return to South Carolina, and Notice of Removal, U.S. Bank National Association failed to use ordinary care in processing the Mortgage Assistance Program Application; failed to follow guidelines as mandated by HUD/FHA; repeated requests for completion of additional Mortgage Assistance Program Applications appears to have be an attempt to cover the above stated failures; August 2022 acquisition of this Petitioner's home without due process all undersore US Bank National Associations underlying intention was to harm, harass, and violate this Petitioners rights by pursuing a frivolous foreclosure.
4. An extension of time will not cause prejudice to Respondents or this Petitioner, as this Court would likely grant at least one of the motions pending, regardless of whether an extension is granted; and it will ensure this Petitioner does not endure another unlawful auction of her home. In addition, an extension will ensure the Respondent will not need to prepare a brief in opposition for this Court as one is due to the US Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit.

## Conclusion

For the foregoing reasons, Petitioner respectfully requests that the time to file the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari before judgment for this case be extended 60 days, until April 19, 2025, halting all foreclosure activity until review and disposition of this case.
