
**AFFIDAVIT OF
GEORGE S. GLASSMEYER**

Personally appeared before me George S. Glassmeyer, who, first being duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

1. My name is George Glassmeyer. I am the plaintiff and requester of information in the above-referenced action. I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this affidavit and am competent to testify about them.
2. I have a long-standing interest and concern about how the South Carolina Lottery Commission fulfills its statutory mandate and manages public funds.
3. I have especially been concerned about potential mismanagement of lottery revenue, to include embezzlement and employee misconduct, whereby portions of these amounts are siphoned off and stay with the Commission or its employees, similar to situations involving other lotteries around the nation.
4. To verify the Defendant's representations are accurate, as to the identities of particular lottery winners and how much prize money to each was actually awarded, it would be necessary to contact the lottery winners for the limited purpose of verifying this information.

5. Defendant's stance in this litigation and past litigation concerning lottery winner information does not afford me the opportunity to learn the activities of the Defendant and at minimum cost or delay.
6. Defendant though has provided me information regarding lottery winners, including their names, to me in the past so any statement that they have always enforced a policy to withhold their names is simply not true.
7. Defendant has also credited me with assisting in uncovering employee misconduct in the past. I previously submitted a SCFOIA request to Defendant concerning the discipline history of a former employee. A response I received from Defendant to that request is attached as Exhibit A.

If Mr. Berry was ever the subject or target of any disciplinary action, please provide the relevant details.

I get that this issue seems to be an onion with infinite layers, but I am hopeful that we are nearing the end. Again, thanks for your responsive and timely efforts.

Hi Dolly,

Thanks for providing the investigative report. After examining it, I have a few remaining concerns and questions.

First, while I did not suggest that both payouts went to the same person, I certainly did not rule it out. Nonetheless, I am mystified as to how two winners' payouts for the same gross prize amount, made within three days of each other, were for a different amount. I understand that various taxes and possible setoffs are deducted from the gross prize amount prior to payment to a claimant, but I doubt that the tax tables were revised during the three days at issue. Kindly explain this discrepancy.

Also, as I noted in my complaint, I found it suspicious that two winners' checks, for nearly identical amounts were presumably issued to two claimants, both presumably residing in the relatively small city of Conway, SC when your office reported only a total of 30 million dollar plus winners over a nearly two year period. While I understand that your investigators determined that both claims were separate and legitimate, my suspicion remains.

I additionally noted that the prize amount, claim number, and date were also absent from the bottom of the 10-25-2022 claim form. Your investigative report fails to address these concerns.

Finally, please advise what, if any, disciplinary action has been, or will be, imposed against Scoot Berry for failing to follow SCEL procedures as noted above.

Dear Ms. Garfield:

In my below email to you dated July 18, 2023, I reference a copy of a lottery winner's claim form which you provided to me in response to my FOIA request of June 16, 2023. I noted that this form did not bear an authorized signature, or an official's name. Additionally, the prize amount, claim number, and date in the lower right corner are also absent.

Upon review of the checks that you provided in response to Item #4 of my FOIA request, that were presumably issued to the winners who submitted the claim forms that you provided, it is clear that one or more SCEL employees authorized disbursement, allowed disbursement, or disbursed at least \$690,000.00 in public funds without following established SCEL protocol or procedure. I also find it somewhat suspicious that two winner's checks for virtually the same amount were both issued to a payee in Conway, SC within 3 days of each other.

As a South Carolina citizen, resident, and taxpayer all of these facts cause me great concern as I suspect wrongdoing by one or more SCEL employees, and potential embezzlement of public funds. I ask that you immediately cause an internal investigation to be undertaken and to appraise me of the results of same. Should your office determine that criminal activity may have occurred, I request that you immediately notify the State Law Enforcement Division (SLED).

I ask that you consider this email as a formal complaint by me. I remain available to cooperate with your investigative staff as may be required.
