**MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO PETITION FOR REHEARING**

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Attorneys for Respondents

NOW COME Respondents, Dominion Clemson, LLC d/b/a Dominion Senior Living at Patrick Square; Dominion Senior Living, LLC; Dominion Clemson, II, LLC; Dominion Management Group, LLC; and Dominion Group, LLC, by and through their undersigned counsel, pursuant to Rule 263(b), SCACR, and move for an extension of fifteen (15) days' additional time to file/serve a petition for rehearing of this matter, which the Court decided via opinion filed May 7, 2025. *See Weldon v. Dominion Clemson, LLC*, Unpublished Op. No. 2025-UP-157.

Rule 221(a), SCACR, provides, "Petitions for rehearing must be actually received by the appellate court no later than fifteen (15) days after the filing of the opinion, order, judgment, or decree of the court." Based on the May 7, 2025, filing of the Court's opinion in this case, the present deadline to petition for rehearing is the close of business today, Thursday, May 22, 2025, which, in accordance with Rule 263(a), SCACR (regarding computation of time), is the 15th day after the opinion's filing. Because of work-related and other time commitments, the undersigned counsel for Respondents requests the Court's allowance of fifteen (15) days' additional time to petition for rehearing.

Respectfully, the undersigned submits there is good cause for the Court to grant the relief requested herein, as it is, under the circumstances, a reasonable dispensation, timely sought, consistent with the interests of justice, posing no threat of undue prejudice to any other party.

WHEREFORE, Respondents request the Court grant them an extension of 15 days' time to petition for rehearing. By the undersigned's calculations, the grant of this relief would make the new deadline to petition for rehearing June 6, 2025. ADDITIONALLY, for the same reasons set forth in support of the within request for an extension of time, Respondents request the Court hold the present deadline for petitioning for rehearing in abeyance until the Court acts on this motion.
