**MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME OR
TO HOLD TIME PERIODS IN ABEYANCE**

1. On September 26, 2013, Appellant served its Initial Brief of Appellant. Accordingly, Respondent's initial brief is due to be filed and served on or before October 28, 2013. *See* Rule 263(a), SCACR.

2. On even date herewith, Respondent has filed and served a motion for certification of this appeal to the Supreme Court pursuant to Rule 204, SCACR, a copy of which has been submitted to the Clerk of this Court under separate cover.


