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Subject: Monica Murphy V. Halocarbon Products Corporation Appellate Case No. 2025-000008
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Dear Patricia A. Howard,

Since the Court approved my Attorney Frederick (Rick) Hall III to withdraw from representing my Workers' Compensation case after 9 years of waiting for AIG to pay these Medical and Prescription bills that I have paid for so so long, One day, I was told by my Attorney that they were not going to pay the bills for these injuries. I was in disbelief then and now I am disabled on SSDI, my husband separated several years ago and gives little financial support. As of the date of the Gaseous Anhydrous Hydrogen Fluoride +99.99% Inhalation, I lost my good health on 08/11/2015, everyday I feel unwell, dealing with Shortness of Breath, chest pain, Asthma and in muscle pain, peripheral neuropathy, dizziness, brain fog and trouble with recall and unable to sleep well due to nerve pain and muscle spasms. every day and now facing two surgeries in the next several months, if possible. Around 20 months ago, my Cardiologist detected a sound development in my Thoracic Aorta, MRI shows a weak area of the artery wall that has bulged, however, not at aneurysm protocol at this time. However my Cardiologist said that due to this development I need to make sure that I stay as stress free as possible at all times. If it is from the HF chemical an internal burn it could be more risk of a Thoracic Aortic Dissection which is an immediate medical emergency and usually deadly unfortunately. Since my Cardiologist told me to remain stress free. I watched a couple of Supreme Court videos to try to understand what to do. One male Attorney changed his demeanor and stood to attention like he was a soldier. I am sure that it would not be favorable for my heart health nor the Post Traumatic Stress Disorder that I have to represent myself Pro Se. I believe I have a strong case for writ of certiorari, however, I cannot proceed Pro Se. It is the law judicial portion that would cause stress for me. I was beginning to start feeling chest pain just watching the video. . If only Workers Compensation Commissioner Susan Barten would have referred to my Urgent MD on 8/19 the University Hospital Medical Record from 8/21/2015 and my other medical records, it was straight forward what was done beginning with ECGs from Urgent MD on 8/19/15, Then University Hospital ER on 8/12/2015, and University Hospital ER on 8/21/2015 and throughout the In-patient hospital stay through 8/25/2015 and then my individual physicians as time progressed. .

Commissioner Barden did not speak to the prolonged QT Interval, dysrhythmia nor did she speak and allowed me to finish my very important testimony in court from 8/21/2015 until 8/25/2015. .When I arrived at the University Hospital ER the lab documented Critically low hypo-phosphatemia a critical electrolyte especially important for the heart and brain, so low that alone could have caused my death and even though I was on the 1% Calcium Gluconate antidote administered by the Paramedic and then the nurse after arriving at the ER. for a total of 45 minutes. I believe that Senior Management at Halocarbon withheld the 1% Calcium Gluconate violating their Emergency Procedures to mask the hypocalcemia because the ionized calcium is critical to heart electrical system function of the heart, because the fluoride binds with the calcium and seeks calcium and binds with magnesium and the electrical cell is destroyed becoming salts; however, trousseau sign was still dominant in my left hand/arm upon arriving at the ER. The nurse rubbed it out. indicating hypocalcemia. Commissioner Barden did not document the Serum Blood electrolyte imbalance as well as give consideration

to the attending Cardiologist who saw me once I was admitted to the hospital until I left the hospital. Cardiologist Dr. Kelly Lane who evaluated me several days prior to the pacemaker implant. Dr. Lane believed the electrolyte imbalance occurred early on and prolonged QT interval of 0.496 millisecon and Heart dysrhythmia after a time went into total Heart Block and remains until this day making me Pacemaker dependent. She never stated the development of Total Heart Block which Urgent MD and Cardiologist at the ER watched my heart go from Wenckebach to Heart Block 1, 2 and sometimes 3 watched as my heart would go in and out of heart block, and other arrhythmia including dysrhythmia and Heart Blocks at Urgent MD on 8/19/15 and did not send me to the Emergency Room. They sent me home and I was so weak I could not raise my arms up to shower for work so I took a vacation day on 8/20/15. Since it was Workers Compensation who was paying, I had to do what they said even though it was reckless for them to lie to me and all of a sudden they say I have a chronic electrical issue which was incorrect it was clinically inaccurate for the low electrolytes which alone could have caused death and knowing that they did not send me to the Emergency Room. The advice was given by Abdullah Abdullah Cardiology department, I learned when I got the Medical records.. It caused the AV node of my electrical system of my heart at that time electrical tissue called Bundle of His was operating for my AV node at 42 beats per min.. Halocarbon Senior Management when they refused to give the Calcium Gluconate antidote by nebulizer until I could get off the floor on my own and sit in a chair. I worked in a hospital and EMT at SRS for some years and knew I was in really bad shape to be having stridor and cannot think or have the ability to get up off of the floor on my own. I felt so faint and weak and air hunger. I thought I would get up and pass out on concrete.. The Asst. Supervisor was told not to help me but did near the end. Safety Director Ken McDowell Safety Director withheld the antidote and forbade anyone to help me.

Since there is no more time available and due to my medical considerations, I am unable to represent myself Pro Se and must withdraw the petition for writ of certiorari due to my serious health conditions.
