

ORDER

Appellant filed his initial reply brief on February 19, 2025. On February 27, 2025, Appellant filed a motion seeking to extend the time for filing the record on appeal and to amend his designation of matter. Respondent filed a return, opposing only Appellant's motion to amend his designation of matter. Appellant filed a reply. The court denied Appellant's motion to amend his designation of matter without prejudice on the basis Appellant has not indicated the matter he desires to designate. However, it granted Appellant's motion to extend the time for filing the record on appeal to April 15, 2025. On April 15, 2025, Appellant filed an amended designation of matter; the court sent a letter explaining that if Appellant wished for the court to take action, a motion needed to be filed. On April 24, 2025, Respondents filed a motion to strike, seeking to strike Appellant's proposed amended designation of matter. Appellant filed a return, opposing the motion. Respondents did not file a reply. On May 19, 2025, Appellant filed a motion to amend his designation of matter. Respondents filed a return, opposing the motion, and Appellant filed a reply. After careful consideration, Respondents' motion to strike is denied, and Appellant's motion to amend is granted. Appellant's amended designation of matter filed April 15, 2025, is accepted as filed. Appellant shall serve the record on appeal within 20 days of the date of this order. *See* Rule 210(a), SCACR ("[T]he appellant shall serve a copy of the Record on Appeal on each party who has served a brief. Proof of service of the Record shall be immediately filed with the clerk of the appellate court."); Rule 210(b), SCACR ("The appellant must file the Record on Appeal with the clerk of the appellate

court no later than the date his brief(s) are due under Rule 211."); Rule 210(c), SCACR ("The Record on Appeal shall include all matter designated to be included by any party under Rule 209 and shall comply with the requirements of Rule 267.").
