ORDER

On September 26, 2013, this Court granted the appellant's third request for an extension of time to serve and file the initial brief and designation of matter. The Court indicated that no further extensions would be granted absent extraordinary circumstances. The appellant filed a subsequent motion for a fourth extension, indicating the respondent consents to the motion because mediation is scheduled in this matter for November 26, 2013.

The appellant's request for an extension of time to serve and file his initial brief and designation of matter is denied. However, the Court will treat this case as part of the Pilot Program for the Voluntary Mediation of Workers' Compensation Appeals.¹ Accordingly, the time for serving and filing the appellant's initial brief and designation of matter shall be suspended for sixty days to enable the parties to mediate the dispute.
