NOTICE OF APPEAL

Brandon Kevon White appeals the Order issued by the Honorable J. Mark Hayes II on June 12, 2025 denying credit for time he spent incarcerated in the Spartanburg County Detention Center prior to his plea hearing in the Court of General Sessions in Spartanburg County on May 23, 2025. Mr. White was charged with Discharging a Firearm into a Vehicle, Unlawful Carry of a Firearm, and Breach of Peace of a High and Aggravated Nature on November 16, 2023. Mr. White was subsequently released on bond for these charges on November 23, 2023. Bond for these charges was ordered to be revoked on June 10, 2024. Pursuant to the Order to Revoke Bond, Mr. White remained incarcerated until pleading guilty to these charges on May 23, 2025. The calculated period for this time was 347 days. The State's assertion at Mr. White's plea hearing was that, pursuant to §24-12-40 (3) and (4), Mr. White was not entitled to receive credit for the time he remained incarcerated in the Spartanburg County Detention Center subsequent to the bond revocation order issued on June 10, 2024. The Defense contends Mr. White should be entitled to receive 347 days of pre-trial credit for the time he spent incarcerated subsequent to bond revocation. Moreover, the denial of credit for the time Mr. White was incarcerated during this time period would violate his constitutional rights.


