

Dear Ms. Kitchings:

On April 17, 2025, I filed a Motion to Proceed In Forma Pauperis. The Court denied the Motion by way of an Order dated May 30, 2025, and provided me fifteen days to pay the filing fee. I received a copy and notice of the Court's decision regarding this matter on June 3, 2025, by and through the Lee Correctional Institution Legal Mail System.

I am an indigent prisoner who is in-fact employed within the South Carolina Department of Corrections. However, I am unable to receive compensation for my labor due to South Carolina law. Consequently, I've had to look to others for financial assistance. I've been diligently seeking assistance of someone who will provide the funding.

It does seem that I have been successful in this endeavor to acquire funding for the filing fee; however, I am still unable to provide this payment to the Court in the quick time of the fifteen-day allowance. Appellant prays for an additional amount of time in which to satisfy this fee.

As there are three people collaboratively providing the funds, there has been an issue with the logistics of gathering the funding into one basket and then the appropriate avenue for providing to the Court.

The thought was that the funding would be able to be provided to the Court by way of online payment(s). However, Appellant was recently informed that online payment is not an option due to the fact that the E-Filing System must be used, and the E-Filing System is only available to attorneys.

I have been informed that the South Carolina Department of Corrections' – Lee Correctional Institution's mailroom personnel is refusing to allow a check or money order to be mailed to me and that I come to the institution's mailroom with a pre-addressed postage prepaid envelope for mailing the check or money order out to your office.

If making a payment online is an option, please do inform me of this. Also, please inform me of exactly who the check or money order should be made payable to (Jenny A. Kitchings or South Carolina Court of Appeals).

Please find also enclosed, an additional copy of the same along with a self-addressed stamped envelope ("SASE"). Please return to me, by way of this SASE, filed-stamped copies of these said documents.
