
ORDER

On March 17, 2025, the circuit court granted summary judgment in favor of Respondent, finding Appellants breached the sales contract and Respondent was entitled to judgment as a matter of law as to its action for repossession of the 2014 GMC Yukon with the right to dispose of the same and for resulting damages for unpaid amounts on the loan in the total amount of \$18,514.00. Appellants then filed an appeal with this court and moved the circuit court to stay execution of the judgment pending the appeal. On May 8, 2025, the circuit court granted Appellants' motion to stay execution of the judgment and to avoid the repossession and sale of their vehicle, but it required Appellants to post two bonds each in the amount of \$37,028 pursuant to section 18-9-130(2) of the South Carolina Code (2014).

On May 16, 2025, Appellants filed a motion to stay with this court, seeking a stay of the judgment but a waiver of the bond imposed in the circuit court's May 8, 2025 order in its entirety, or in the alternative for a reduced bond amount. Respondent filed a return to the motion to stay, opposing the requested relief. Appellants did not file a reply.

After careful consideration, we vacate the circuit court's May 8, 2025 order and remand for expedited consideration of Appellants' motion to stay with consideration given to whether section 18-9-130(A)(1) of the South Carolina Code (2014) is applicable to the monetary judgment ordered by the circuit court and section 18-9-150 of the South Carolina Code (2014) for the repossession judgment.

Appellants shall provide this court with status updates every thirty days. Further, Appellants shall provide this court with a copy of the circuit court's order ruling on the motion to stay and request for appeal bond within ten days of receiving notice of the order. Appellants' failure to provide this court with status updates every thirty days or to provide this court with the circuit court's ruling within ten days of receiving notice of the order will result in dismissal of this appeal.
