



ORDER


After careful consideration, we dismiss the appeal because the order denying a change of venue is interlocutory and not immediately appealable. *Godley v. Uniroyal Inc.*, 278 S.C. 571, 572, 300 S.E.2d 78, 78 (1983) ("It is generally held that an order granting or refusing a change of venue is interlocutory and therefore not immediately appealable."); *Breland v. Love Chevrolet Olds, Inc.*, 339 S.C. 89, 94, 529 S.E.2d 11, 14 (2000) ("Requiring a defendant to wait until after trial to appeal the issue of proper venue is the most appropriate course to take where any error in that decision will not prejudice the defendant anymore than other interlocutory orders which, if in error, would require a new trial."). The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules. Accordingly, the appeal is dismissed.
