To the South Carolina Court of Appeals, the South Carolina AG, Judge Danny Singleton, Judge McIntosh, and all others with an interest or stake in this case,

First, I wish to extend my sincere gratitude to Caitlyn Singleton. Your dedication to service is admirable. Your expressions of compassion are genuinely touching. Your professional competence stands out. It is a rare and powerful thing to know that I can reach out to you, even in the darkest of times, and be met with genuine help.

Now, I must address the shameful and underhanded tactic just attempted by the Attorney General's office. In my response to their motion to dismiss, I openly disclosed that I am currently out of the country. Despite this, the Attorney General's office chose to file their return to my response in hard copy format, supposedly mailing it to my residence in America. Prior to this filing, every submission from their office had been made electronically. The clear intent behind this switch to hard copy was to ensure that I would not receive the filing for months, thereby preventing me from submitting a timely reply.

Late last night, in my time zone, I called to check on the status of my case. Caitlyn informed me of the filing and that the deadline for my reply was midnight. I have now missed that

deadline by approximately one hour. Nonetheless, I will file my reply soon and hope that the Court of Appeals sees through this petty and dishonest behavior by the Attorney General's office, and chooses to uphold justice over technical gamesmanship.

The greatest tragedy here is not merely my personal loss of freedom and justice at the hands of what is and has been a well-organized crime syndicate known as the Oconee County Court system. The true tragedy is that such behavior has become accepted, if not encouraged by the powerful in our state, such as attorney general Alan Wilson. I firmly believe that many innocent men and women have suffered under this system, where the Attorney General's office relies on procedural maneuvering rather than the merits of the case. If this is what America has become, then shame on us all. The people are meant to stand in defense of justice against the abuses of government. In this duty, we have clearly failed.

So I now place my faith in your hands. There is no truly informed, legally astute person alive who can review the facts and merits of this case and believe that justice has been done. Our country needs a new motto: *"Land of the free—as long as you obey and bow to the power elite."*

Let me be clear: I have not taken a position against the South Carolina Court of Appeals. However, I do recognize that institutions often protect their own, so my expectations remain measured. Still, it is not in my nature to pre-judge. I sincerely hope that the judges of this Court value morality and justice enough to hold the Attorney General's office accountable for this egregious conduct—not for my sake alone, but to force them to abandon these practices out of respect and fear of genuine justice moving forward.

I have broken no law and have never willfully violated any court order. Yet I have been persecuted by a corrupt court system. I have lost my company, most of my income, 40 days of freedom, and my reputation in my community, where I am now viewed as a criminal. The Attorney General and his associates clearly fear that the light of justice may finally shine upon this matter, so they resort to inappropriate procedural trickery to continue their relentless persecution.

I will now sacrifice personal time and service to craft a reply to this latest maneuver. I will do so at the expense of my volunteer work on behalf of the children of Lira Town College, where I serve as a full-time teacher and educational consultant. The actions of this criminal enterprise that hides behind God's name and the State of South Carolina affects not only me but my family and all those I serve.

I pray that there remain men and women of courage who will stand against these criminals, beginning with Attorney General Alan Wilson himself.
