

ORDER

On March 20, 2025, the court granted counsel for Appellants' motion to relieve counsel and held the appeal in abeyance for thirty days to allow Appellants to procure new counsel. The court cautioned Appellants that if no attorney had made an appearance on Appellants' behalf within thirty days from the date of the order, Appellants would be presumed to be proceeding pro se. On April 11, 2025, James B. Richardson, Jr. sent an email on behalf of Appellants, explaining he was unable to undertake their representation but was writing on Appellants' behalf to request a thirty-day extension of time. Respondent filed a return in opposition, arguing the final briefs were filed before Appellants' counsel was relived and "any additional time would act as an injustice to [Respondent]." After careful consideration, we decline to construe the email as a motion. No attorney has made an appearance on behalf of Appellants, who are presumed to be proceeding pro se. The appeal is no longer held in abeyance.
