## ORDER

---

On June 30, 2025, Appellant filed a "motion to amend and supplement pleadings" and a related "motion to argue against precedent." We construe Appellant's motion to amend and supplement pleadings as a motion to amend his designation of matter and supplement the record on appeal to include "transactions or occurrences or events which have happened since the date" of his filings. Appellant requests permission to include materials concerning his appearance before the Parole Board on June 18, 2025. After careful consideration, we deny Appellant's request to amend his designation of matter and supplement the record on appeal. *See* Rule 210(c), SCACR ("The [r]ecord shall not . . . include matter which was not presented to the lower court or tribunal."). In the alternative, Appellant requested this court remand for rehearing of the Parole Board's decision to deny parole. After careful consideration, we deny Appellant's request to remand. Appellant's motion to argue against precedent is denied. *See* Rule 217, SCACR (noting permission is not needed to file a brief arguing against precedent).
