

SUPERINTENDENCY COMPLAINT AND REQUEST FOR SUPERVISORY CONTROL

Re: Court of Appeals Case No. 2025-001299

Lower Court: Dorchester County Case No. 2024-CP-18-01459

I respectfully bring to the attention of the Chief Judge and Clerk of Court a serious jurisdictional violation that requires supervisory intervention.

On June 27, 2025, I filed a Notice of Appeal in the above-captioned matter. The Court of Appeals docket clearly shows the case remains 'Awaiting Transcript' and no Remittitur Date has been entered.

Despite this, Dorchester County Circuit Court has scheduled and is preparing to hear motions on September 15, 2025, and October 6, 2025

By law, jurisdiction remains exclusively with the Court of Appeals until remittitur. The trial court has no authority to proceed on substantive motions. Allowing hearings to go forward undermines appellate authority and denies due process.

Relief Requested:

1. Issue a supervisory order directing the Dorchester County Circuit Court to halt all proceedings until remittitur has issued.
2. Clarify for the record that the Supersedeas Rule remains in effect pending appeal.
3. Provide written confirmation that this matter is being addressed administratively.
