ORDER

On August 12, 2025, Appellants filed a "Motion for Correction of Case Index" and a "Motion to Strike/Notice of Defective Filing." Respondent filed a return to the motion to strike, and Appellants filed a reply on August 28, 2025, seeking sanctions. After careful consideration, we deny the "Motion for Correction of Case Index" as not properly before this court and deny the "Motion to Strike/Notice of Defective Filing" and request for sanctions against Respondent.

On August 18, 2025, Appellants filed a "Motion to Notify Court of Improper Docket Alterations," and a "Supplemental Statement in Support of Motion" on August 19, 2025. Respondent did not file a return. After careful consideration, we deny the "Motion to Notify Court of Improper Docket Alterations," and the "Supplemental Statement in Support of Motion."

On August 28, 2025, Appellants filed a "Motion to Accept and Review the Appellants Record and to Open an Investigation and Notify S.L.E.D." Respondent did not file a return. After careful consideration, we deny the motion.

On September 2, 2025, Appellant filed a motion to stay the circuit court proceedings in a case number 2024-CP-1801459, arguing a decision in that case could moot this appeal. Appellants "renewed" this motion on September 8, 2025. Respondent did not file a return. After careful consideration, we deny Appellants' September 2, 2025 motion to stay because case number 2024-CP-1801459 is not properly before this court. Additionally, we clarify this ruling has no impact on this court's August 13, 2025 order continuing the temporary injunction and

remanding to the circuit court. We further clarify that this court has not requested exhibits or the transportation of any exhibits in this appeal.

On September 12, 2025, Appellants filed a document titled "Superintendency Complaint and Request for Supervisory Control." On September 16 and 17, 2025, Appellants filed an "Urgent Notice of Trial Court Exceeding Limited Remand Authority" and "Notice of Improperly Scheduled Motions." To the extent these are motions, after careful consideration, we deny the requested relief.

Finally, we take this opportunity to caution Appellants against filing frivolous or repetitive motions.
