Dear Ms. Kitchings:

I am writing in response to the deficiency letter regarding my *Reply to the Return to the Motion to Strike*. The new Proof of Service is attached to this email.

I have updated the Proof of Service to comply with the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules. I apologize for the earlier misunderstanding. I believed that only new motions required mailing and that replies could be served by email. Nonetheless, because I had other documents to send to the Attorney General's Office, I have already mailed copies of these filings as well.

I would also like to respectfully remind the Court that this appeal arose out of a criminal

contempt charge that was disguised as civil contempt in order to deprive me of my right to counsel and other constitutional protections. I appreciate the Court's patience and understanding as I continue to seek justice against the injustices that originated in the Oconee County courts.

I am forced to proceed *pro se* because I have limited resources, and the attorneys I have spoken with have not been willing to take this case—one even suggesting that standing up against corruption in the South Carolina courts would be “career suicide.” I sincerely hope that is not the true nature of the state of our justice system, and I pray for all who have suffered under such a malicious system of corruption.

I would not have believed this could happen in America had it not happened to me and my family. I remain astounded that the Attorney General's Office has chosen to focus on procedural technicalities to protect the corrupt acts of the Oconee County judiciary that resulted in my loss of liberty and devastation to my family.

I continue to pray that this Court will defend the honor of the South Carolina judiciary and the integrity of the United States Constitution.
