**MOTION TO ALLOW APPELLANT TO TERMINATE THE BRIEFING SCHEDULE  
AND BEGIN ANEW UPON RECEIPT OF ALL TRANSCRIPTS**

Counsel for the Appellant moves that the Court terminate the current briefing schedule and allow the Appellant to commence the briefing schedule once all transcripts requested are received by Counsel. Counsel timely filed a Notice of Intent to Appeal and timely requested the trial transcript, the immunity hearing transcript, and two transcripts from two post-trial hearings.


Due to his trial schedule and ongoing work on other appeals, Counsel was in the process of preparing a second request for an extension to file the Initial Brief in this case. During this process, Counsel discovered that he was missing a full day of the immunity hearing held in this case and that he never received the transcripts from the two post-trial hearings. Counsel has

communicated with the court reporter and has been assured that the transcripts will be completed as soon as possible.

Over the last one and one-half years, Counsel has experienced a complete turnover in staff. Counsel previously had two very capable paralegals who had been employed by him for 18–19 years, as well as an associate who had been with him for 7–8 years. During the last one and one-half years, Counsel employed and discharged five paralegals/secretaries until approximately three to four months ago, when Counsel was fortunate enough to restaff his office with two capable paralegals and a competent associate. During this period, many matters were not properly followed up on, including due dates and follow-up regarding various issues, such as appeals that Counsel had pending.

Counsel has previously requested an extension in which to file Appellant's Initial Brief, and the brief is currently due to be filed on Friday, October 24, 2025.

WHEREFORE Counsel prays that the current briefing schedule be terminated and begin anew when all transcripts have been received.


