Dear Ms. Kitchings:

I represent the Respondent in the above-referenced case. Oral argument is tomorrow. While preparing yesterday for the argument, I noticed that the Record on Appeal served on my client does not match the Record filed with the Court.

Appellants served the Record electronically, via an email with a link to the Record.

Three weeks later, Appellants filed, by email, the Record, broken into 4 documents. Appellants did so via two emails, each containing two of the “volumes.” The total page count of all the “volumes” is less than 500 pages.

The Index of the served Record differs from the filed Record in that almost every page number in the one is different from the page number for the same entry in the other.

By combining the four emailed “volumes” and removing the title pages from Volumes II through IV, I was able to “reconstitute” what Appellants filed into a single volume. But the filed volumes contain one fewer pages than does the served Record.

I reached out to opposing counsel via email yesterday at 6:54 pm about these problems, but as of this writing, I have not received a reply.

C-TRACK’s public listing does not show all the “volumes,” as some contain personally identifying information. (That is why, in organizing what Respondent filed, I used the stamped volumes the Clerk returned to Appellants, copying me.) The Record I was served has since been removed from the link via which I was served. A bound copy was never provided to my client.

If there is a motion the Court would like my client to make, please let me know.
