

## ORDER




Petitioner's application for post-conviction relief was denied by Judge Edgar W. Dickson. No notice of appeal was filed. Petitioner now seeks a writ of certiorari from an order issued by Judge Kristi F. Curtis granting Petitioner a belated review of Judge Dickson's order pursuant to *Austin v. State*, 305 S.C. 453, 409 S.E.2d 395 (1991).

We grant the petition for a writ of certiorari from Judge Curtis's order. However, because Judge Dickson's order contains insufficient findings of fact and conclusions of law regarding Petitioner's PCR allegations, we cannot conduct an *Austin* review of the order. Therefore, we vacate Judge Dickson's order and remand this matter to the circuit court to issue an order that complies with section 17-27-80 of the South Carolina Code (2014) and Rule 52(a), SCRPC. The circuit court shall be limited to a review of the transcript of the PCR hearing presided over by Judge Dickson and the record that was before him in preparing the amended order. The order shall be issued within forty-five days of this Court's mailing of the remittitur, and any aggrieved party may serve and file a new notice of appeal from the amended order.
