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On May 22, 2025, Plaintiffs moved under South Carolina Rule of Civil Procedure 59(e) to alter or amend the Court’s May 13, 2025 summary judgment order to remove statements that the Plaintiffs did not argue that subsection 23-3-15(A)(9) violates the non-delegation doctrine. Defendants did not oppose the motion. Because Plaintiffs argued that interpreting subsection 23-3-15(A)(9) to authorize SLED’s ALPR database would violate the nondelegation doctrine, the Court GRANTS Plaintiffs motion and will issue an amended order.
