**MOTION TO TRANSFER VIDEO EXHIBIT FROM TENTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT TO THE SOUTH
CAROLINA COURT OF APPEALS**

Appellant, Jason M. Boyle, pro se, respectfully moves this Court for an order directing the Clerk of Court for the Tenth Judicial Circuit to transmit to this Court a video exhibit that was filed in the underlying Circuit Court proceedings on a USB memory drive, so that it may be included in the Record on Appeal. In support of this Motion, Appellant states as follows:

1. This appeal arises from proceedings in the Tenth Judicial Circuit Court for Oconee County, South Carolina, under case number 2024-CP-3700451
2. On November 6, 2024, Appellant filed a USB memory drive with the Circuit Court containing a video exhibit titled:

“Video from May 24, 2024 Used in the Probate Hearing of June 17, 2024.”

This filing is reflected in the Circuit Court’s docket and was accepted into the record as evidence.

3. The Video Exhibit depicts the Appellant’s conduct in the Oconee County Probate Court lobby on May 24, 2024, including visible details of the courthouse entrance area, the absence of any posted notice regarding the South Carolina Supreme Court Administrative Order on electronic devices, the fact no court proceedings were interrupted and the judge was not present and the interactions forming the basis of the underlying contempt findings.
4. The Video Exhibit is directly material to several issues raised on appeal, including (but not limited to):
 - (a) whether Appellant had actual or constructive notice of the administrative order;
 - (b) whether the alleged conduct constituted direct or constructive contempt; and
 - (c) whether the Probate Court’s factual findings are supported by the record.

5. The written Record on Appeal does not and cannot reproduce the contents of the Video Exhibit. Because the medium is audiovisual, review of the actual video is necessary for a full and fair appellate consideration of the issues.
6. Appellant was informed by a clerk of this Court that audiovisual exhibits are not automatically transmitted and that Appellant must file a Motion requesting the Court of Appeals to direct the Circuit Court Clerk to transmit the original electronic exhibit.
7. Appellant therefore respectfully requests that this Court order the Clerk of Court for the Tenth Judicial Circuit to transmit the USB memory drive filed on November 6, 2024, containing the Video Exhibit titled **“Video from May 24, 2024 Used in the Probate Hearing of June 17, 2024,”** so that the exhibit may be incorporated into and considered as part of the Record on Appeal.

Request for Expedited Consideration

8. Appellant respectfully requests expedited consideration of this Motion. Each day that this appeal proceeds without a complete record prolongs the unresolved constitutional injuries at issue and causes continuing, concrete harm to Appellant’s life, rights, and daily circumstances. Prompt transmission of the Video Exhibit is necessary to prevent further injustice and to allow this Court to review the case on a fully developed record.

WHEREFORE, Appellant respectfully requests that this Court:

- A. Grant this Motion;
- B. Order the Clerk of Court for the Tenth Judicial Circuit to promptly transmit to the Clerk of the South Carolina Court of Appeals the Video Evidence filed on November 6, 2024;
- C. Direct that the Video Exhibit be included and treated as part of the Record on Appeal in this

matter; and

D. Award such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.


