**RESPONDENT’S CORRECTED UNOPPOSED MOTION  
FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE ITS BRIEF**

Pursuant to Rules 240, 242, and 263(b), SCACR, Respondent South Carolina Board of Financial Institutions respectfully moves this Court for an extension of time to file its Brief in this matter. Petitioners CDM Corporation, Inc. and Guardian Fiduciary Services, LLC consent to the requested relief.

In support of this motion, Respondent states as follows:

1. On November 18, 2025, this Court granted certiorari to the Court of Appeals of *South Carolina Board of Financial Institutions v. CDM Corporation, Inc. and Guardian Fiduciary Services, LLC*, Appellate Case No. 2023-000017 (S.C. Ct. App. filed May 28, 2025).

2. On December 18, 2025, Petitioners filed their opening brief, along with the appendix.

3. Under Rule 242(i), SCACR, Respondent’s brief is due to be filed on or before January 20, 2025.

4. The winter holidays, including five business days during which the courts of this State are officially closed, fall during the allotted period for the filing of Respondent's brief.

5. Respondent's lead counsel, Shawn D. Eubanks, General Counsel to the State Treasurer's Office, also is currently taking a leave of absence to address a family medical issue.

6. Further, Respondent has recently engaged outside counsel, R. Walker Humphrey, II and Elizabeth Zeck of Willoughby Humphrey & D'Antoni, P.A., to assist in representing this state agency.

7. In consideration of the family obligations inherent in the holiday season and with respect to Counsel Eubanks' family medical issue, as well as to allow new counsel to develop familiarity with the issues on appeal, counsel for Respondent request an extension of 20 days to file Respondent's brief.

8. If the Court grants this request, counsel for Respondent calculate that they will have until February 9, 2025, in which to file this brief.

9. This is the first request for an extension by Respondent to this Court, and the time herein is within the 20-day cumulative maximum amount of time allowable for extensions under Supreme Court Order 2014-07-16-01.

10. This request is made in good faith, not for purposes of delay, and Petitioners will not be prejudiced by this extension.

11. Counsel for Respondent have consulted with counsel for Petitioners, and the undersigned is authorized to state that Petitioners consent to the granting of this request.

Counsel for Respondent therefore respectfully request that the Court grant this motion and extend the time for filing Respondent's brief until February 9, 2025.
