ORDER

On December 10, 2025, Appellant filed a corrected motion to transport a video exhibit and requested expedited consideration of this motion. After careful consideration, we grant both the request for expedited consideration and the motion to transport the video exhibit. Pursuant to Rule 210(f) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules, it is ordered that the Clerk of Court for Oconee County release the May 24, 2025 video used in the June 17, 2024 probate hearing. This video, filed on November 6, 2024 with the Oconee County circuit court, is to be transported to this court by the South Carolina Attorney General's Office for consideration in the above referenced matter.¹

On December 10, 2025, Appellant filed a motion to exceed the page limits for his final brief. *Cf.* Rule 208(b)(5), SCACR (explaining that “principal briefs shall not exceed fifty (50) pages,” and “[o]n motion, the appellate court may grant a party permission to exceed those limitations”). After careful consideration, we grant this request to exceed the page limits and we accept the final brief filed on December 10, 2025, as filed.

Finally, on December 10, 2025, Appellant filed a motion to expedite consideration of his appeal. As of December 17, 2025, this court had received the final briefs and record on appeal. After careful consideration, we grant Appellant's motion to expedite. Because this court rosters cases in advance, this appeal cannot be considered in the next term of court; however, this appeal shall be handled as expeditiously as possible.²

² On December 15, 2025, Appellant filed a supplement to his motion to expedite. Because we have considered his motion to expedite filed on December 10, 2025, Appellant's December 15, 2025 supplement is now moot.
