

## ORDER

On October 22, 2025, Appellants filed a motion for limited remand, seeking an order from this court remanding the matter for the limited purpose of allowing Appellants to file a motion pursuant to Rule 60(b)(4) of the South Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure. Appellants simultaneously filed a consent motion to stay, wherein Appellants represented Respondent agreed to a stay of briefing pending a decision on the request for limited remand and if the limited remand was denied, the parties agreed to Appellant filing their initial brief within ten days of the date of the order denying the motion for limited remand. Respondent filed a return to the motion for limited remand, opposing the motion. Appellants filed a reply.

After careful consideration, the motion for limited remand is denied. Appellant's consent motion to stay is granted to the extent that Appellant's initial brief and designation of matter shall be served and filed within ten days of the date of this order.
