**RETURN TO RESPONDENT CITY OF BELTON'S  
MOTION FOR COSTS ON APPEAL**

---

The Appellant respectfully requests that this Court deny the Motion for Costs, filed by the Respondent, City of Belton, on December 29, 2025, because the Appellant has limited income and is unable to afford said costs. As shown on a Financial Declaration that has been executed by the Appellant and attached hereto as Exhibit A, the Appellant is seventy (70) years old, retired, and his sole sources of income are a small pension and monthly Social Security benefits. Accordingly, the Appellant's gross monthly income is only \$2,380.00 per month, and his monthly expenses usually are greater than that amount. The Respondent, City of Belton, is

requesting more than double the Appellant's gross monthly income in costs, so payment of the same, in addition to his regular monthly expenses, would constitute an undue burden on the Appellant.

Alternatively, if the Court grants the Respondent's request for costs, the Appellant would respectfully request that the Court only award the sum of \$2,503.65 to said Respondent. The Respondent has requested attorney's fees in the total amount of \$5,000.00 and copying costs in the amount of \$3.65. However, the total allowable attorney's fees in this case should be limited to \$2,500.00 pursuant to South Carolina Appellate Court Rules. Rule 222(b), SCACR, sets the allowable attorney's fee award at \$2,500.00 for prevailing parties in this Court. Rule 222(e), SCACR, clarifies that this Court may award costs in cases like the instant case where the Supreme Court has denied a Petition for Writ of Certiorari. However, this provision should not be construed to authorize this Court to award an additional \$2,500.00 in attorney's fees pursuant to Rule 242(j), SCACR. Instead, that Rule provides that the Supreme Court may award of an additional \$2,500.00 in attorney's fees only in cases where a Petition for Writ of Certiorari has been granted.
