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**FILE 240 MOTION TO ACCEPT TRANSCRIPT REQUEST OUT OF TIME, IN LIGHT OF
CONSTRUCTIVE-TRUST STEWARDSHIP, REDEMPTION CONTEXT, AND NON-ABANDONMENT OF
THE TRUST RES** Case No. [2025-002352] January 7, 2026

The Appellant appears **solely in fiduciary capacity as Steward Trustee of the STCJ Network Revocable Living Trust** ("the Trust"). In that capacity, the Steward Trustee invokes this Court's **equitable supervisory authority in conscience** over matters of trust-res stewardship, and asks the Court to **recognize as done that which ought to have been done** with respect to the timing and acceptance of the transcript request.

This invocation is made:

- in fulfillment of **fiduciary duty to protect the res and beneficiaries,**
- in pursuit of **settlement and restoration rather than controversy,** and
- in reliance upon the maxims that:
 - **Equity abhors forfeiture;**
 - **Equity presumes against abandonment where vigilance is present;**
 - **Equity regards as done that which ought to have been done;** and
 - **Equity will not suffer a wrong without a remedy.**

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SC Court of Appeals

Consistent with the principle, preserved in the Judicature tradition, that **where law and equity differ upon the same subject, equity prevails,** the Steward Trustee tenders the following.

I. BACKGROUND AND ORDER DATE

The hearing below occurred on May 30, 2025 in the Clarendon County Court of Common Pleas before the Hon. Clifton Newman.

The order affecting the trust res was **not executed and entered until October 23, 2025,** as reflected in the written order and related confidential memorandum of lodgment.

The Trustee's appellate obligations therefore arose in practical effect only after the order was executed in writing.

II. CHRONOLOGY OF FIDUCIARY DILIGENCE (NOVEMBER–DECEMBER 2025)

On November 20, 2025, the Steward Trustee lodged with this Court a Notice of Appeal in Exclusive Equity, together with a Correspondence–Incoming list of documents stamped

“RECEIVED – Nov 20 2025 – SC Court of Appeals,” which identified the trust-equity filings, exhibits, and record materials being tendered.

During December 2025, the Steward Trustee engaged in additional lodgments directed to the chambers of Chief Judge H. Bruce Williams, requesting that the trust-res matter be treated in exclusive equity, in chambers / in camera, and removed from the public docket. This included email correspondence and a written Private Equity Lodgment Cover Letter with attached trust instruments and notices.

On December 30, 2025, the Steward Trustee executed and transmitted a written transcript request to Court Reporter Julia Titus-Emerson, identifying the May 30, 2025 hearing and requesting cost and deposit instructions.

On December 31, 2025, in direct response to the Court’s deficiency correspondence dated December 22, 2025, the Steward Trustee transmitted a Curing Deficiency submission to Clerk Kitchings, enclosing: the order being appealed, a Rule-207 motion regarding transcript timing, a copy of the transcript request letter, and the Court’s own deficiency letters.

Taken together, these steps demonstrate **continuous fiduciary vigilance and stewardship**, not delay or abandonment. Any apparent gap between May and late December reflects:

- the time required for the order to be formally entered and signed,
- the Trustee’s preparation and lodgment of equity instruments and the notice of appeal, and
- prompt pursuit of the transcript once the order, appeal, and equity lodgments were in place.

In equity, **vigilance and conscience — not bare calendar intervals — measure diligence.**

III. NON-ABANDONMENT AND CONSTRUCTIVE-TRUST POSTURE

Throughout this period, the Steward Trustee remained in actual possession and constructive stewardship of the res, having previously conveyed the property into the STCJ Network Revocable Living Trust by Trust Transfer Grant Deed and Certificate of Trust.

The Trustee has **never abandoned the res**, and has remained in **continuous possession and constructive stewardship**. Equity presumes **non-abandonment where vigilance is present**, rebutting any inference of waiver or forfeiture.

In conscience and under the teachings of the equity fathers, such circumstances call for **constructive-trust protection and restoration**, not forfeiture based upon procedural timing alone.

Acceptance of the transcript request out of time ensures that the Court may consider:

- the sealed equity lodgments and exemplified materials,
- the non-abandonment and constructive-trust narrative, and
- the Steward Trustee's consistent efforts to seek settlement and closure in equity.

IV. EQUITABLE INVOCATION AND RELIEF

WHEREFORE, in fiduciary duty and conscience, the Steward Trustee invokes this Court to:

1. **Accept the transcript request out of time** and deem the Trustee's efforts as **substantial and sufficient compliance** in light of the continuous fiduciary efforts described above;
2. Direct that the transcript of the May 30, 2025 hearing be prepared upon deposit and transmitted to this Court in the ordinary course; and
3. Grant such further equitable assistance in stewardship and restoration of the trust res as the conscience of the Court may deem appropriate, consistent with equity's abhorrence of forfeiture and its presumption against abandonment where vigilance is present.
