ORDER

Based on the vote of the Court, the petitions for writs of certiorari are granted on the following questions:

May an employee seek private remedies for an employer's violation of section 41-10-30(A) of the South Carolina Code (2021)?

Did the court of appeals err in holding the question of whether Respondent-Petitioner knew or should have known he had a claim more than three years before filing his action, thus barring the action under the three-year statute of limitations of section 41-10-80(C) of the South Carolina Code (2021), was properly submitted to the jury?

The petitions for writs of certiorari are denied on all other questions. The parties shall proceed to serve and file ten additional copies of the appendix and ten copies of their briefs in the manner provided by Rule 242(i), SCACR.
