

it seems unlikely that the victim came to Defendant's workplace with the intention of attacking Defendant.

The court weighed each of these factors and came to a sentence that the court deems fair, taking into consideration both the brutality of the attack and the mitigating circumstances. Therefore, Defendant's Motion for Reconsideration of Defendant's Sentence is DENIED.
