REPLY TO THE RESPONDENTS' MOTION TO REJECT THE INITIAL AMENDMENT BRIEF FILED
ON FEBRUARY 9, 2026 BY THE REPENDENTS

I. THE THRESHOLD ISSUE: LACK OF SUBJECT MATTER JURISDICTION

TO THE HONORABLE COURT: This Court cannot grant the Respondents' motion because the orders they seek to enforce were issued without Subject Matter Jurisdiction and are therefore VOID AB INITIO.

THE CANON 3E RECUSAL: On May 15th, Commissioner Wilkinson Jr. recused himself from this case under Canon 3E. This recusal legally dissolved the three-commissioner panel, requiring a new panel to be constituted and a de novo hearing to be held.

THE STATED VIOLATION: In the footnote on page two of the Full Commission Order dated May 16, 2025 (Exhibit B), Commissioner Campbell STATED that reconvening was not necessary.

I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Single Commissioner

On May 15, 2024, a hearing was held before a Single Commissioner to determine issues set forth on the parties' Forms 50 and 51.¹

Claimant asserted he sustained injuries on October 14, 2022, to his left shoulder, left arm, right hip and right leg when he slipped and fell in the course and scope of his employment with Employer. Claimant further asserted he was not at maximum medical improvement for his injuries. Claimant sought a finding of compensability and causally related medical treatment for the same. Claimant further sought Temporary Total Disability benefits from October 18, 2022, to the present and continuing. In the alternative, Claimant sought a permanent total disability determination.

Claimant asserted on his Pre-Hearing Brief that he sustained additional injuries to his right shoulder, right arm, bilateral wrists, and low back in his work accident on October 14, 2022. However, during the initial hearing, Claimant testified that his right shoulder injury was not a part of this claim. (Hr. Tr. p. 75.)

Defendants denied Claimant's claim. Defendants specifically asserted during the initial hearing that Claimant had been receiving workers' compensation benefits under the state laws of Louisiana for the past 9-10 years, and did not work during this period. (Hr. Tr. p. 13.) Defendants continued that Claimant was allegedly injured within one (1) hour of returning to work in South Carolina, but failed to report said injury to Employer for five (5) days. (*Id.*) Defendants maintained these events, combined with the ongoing discrepancy as to Claimant's injured body parts and lack of medical causation in

¹ This matter was originally heard by the Honorable Avery B. Wilkerson, Jr. on May 15, 2024. Following the hearing, Commissioner Wilkerson recused himself from the proceeding in accordance with Canon 3E, Rule 501 SCACR. The case was assigned to Commissioner R. Michael Campbell, II, for adjudication. Commissioner Campbell reviewed the record and determined it was not necessary to reconvene the Hearing, as all parties had given testimony, submitted medical evidence, and there was sufficient evidence in the record to render a decision. (Single Commissioner's Decision and Order filed on September 9, 2024, p. 2.)





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II. INTRODUCTION: CANON 3 AND SENATE MANAGERS' STANDARDS

Under Canon 3 of the Code of Judicial Conduct and the oversight standards of Senate Managers, the right to a full hearing is absolute. A commissioner cannot "choose" to bypass a hearing required for adjudication. By refusing the De Novo process, the Commissioner violated the Appellant's constitutional right to be heard.

II. TABLE OF AUTHORITIES

* *S.C. Dept. of Social Services v. Beeks*, 325 S.C. 243 (1997): Orders issued without jurisdiction are void ab initio.



* S.C. Code Ann. § 42-17-40: Mandates decision based on the entire record.

* Canon 3, S.C. Code of Judicial Conduct: Rules on judge disqualification/recusal.

III. INTRODUCTION

The Appellant, Amos Mack, submits this Reply to prove a Structural Error that cannot be cured by the lower agency. The record confirms that on January 13, 2025, the agency was ordered to complete the record. They failed. In a Footnote on Page 2 of the May 16, 2025 Order, 

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I. **SUBJECT MATTER JURISDICTION: THE MANDATED RULE**

This Court must reverse the lower decisions because the Commission never obtained Subject Matter Jurisdiction. Following the Recusal of Commissioner Wilkerson under Canon 3E, the case was reassigned to Commissioner Campbell. Under South Carolina law, it is a Mandated Rule—not a choice—that the newly assigned commissioner hold a Devoted, De Novo (New) Hearing to obtain adjudication over the case.

The Admission of Voidance: The Full Commission's May 16, 2025 Order (Footnote, Page 2) admits that Commissioner Campbell deemed a reconvened hearing "not necessary." By skipping this mandate, the Commissioner failed to obtain the jurisdictional power to issue any order. ~~_____~~
manifest illegality on the face of the record.

THE LEGAL NULLITY: By stating that a new hearing was unnecessary, the Commission bypassed mandatory legal procedure. Without a lawfully ~~_____~~ *De novo hearing* Commission lacked the authority to issue an order.

CASE LAW: Under Skinner v. Westinghouse, 380 S.C. 91 (2008), any order issued without subject matter jurisdiction is a legal nullity. Therefore, the September 9, 2024 Order and the May 16, 2025 Order do not legally exist. The Respondents cannot move to reject a brief based on void orders.

II. TOTAL FORFEITURE FOR 36-MONTH MEDICAL ABANDONMENT

Beyond the jurisdictional collapse, the Respondents have FORFEITED their standing to file the February 9th motion.

THE EVIDENCE: The Angela Torres Letter dated November 8, 2022 (Exhibit C) proves the Respondents ~~_____~~ *promised* to provide medical benefits. They willfully refused and have never provided those benefits to this day.

THE FORFEITURE: Under S.C. Code § 42-15-60, by abandoning the Petitioner's medical care for 36 months, the Respondents have forfeited their right to participate in or contest this claim.

III. TOTAL LIQUIDATED DEBT CALCULATION (\$3,258,000.00)

As the manager of the claim following the Respondents' forfeiture, Petitioner has liquidated the total value of the loss under the Act, including loss of employment for life and loss of enjoyment for life.



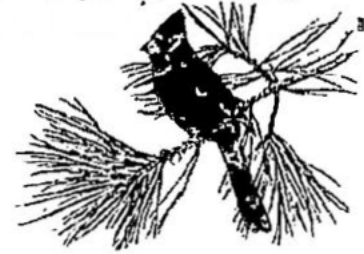

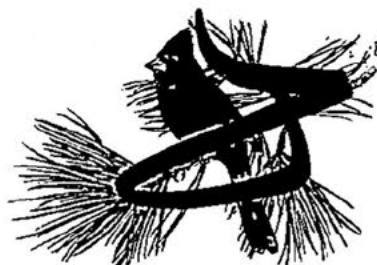
