APPELLANT'S EMERGENCY SUPPLEMENT TO PENDING EMERGENCY MOTIONS

NOW COMES Appellant, acting pro se, and respectfully supplements her pending Emergency Motions filed on January 28, 2026, and February 3, 2026, respectively, as follows:

1. **Status of February 12 Brief:** On February 12, 2026, Appellant filed an Amended Initial Brief under protest. This filing was made as a procedural placeholder to avoid default, as the Court had not yet ruled on the pending Emergency Motion for Extension of Time and Emergency Motion to Supplement.
2. **Ongoing Medical Incapacity:** Appellant's medical condition has significantly deteriorated, resulting in ambulance transport and emergency medical intervention on February 11, 2026 (See Exhibit A, B). Appellant is currently suffering from acute respiratory distress and hypertensive urgency, with documented blood pressure readings of 170/90, severely complicating her pre-existing neurological disability (See Exhibit C).
3. **Prejudice:** Denial of the requested extension would be highly prejudicial. Due to her medical state, Appellant has been unable to conduct the exhaustive legal review required for her claims of Fraud on the Court. Furthermore, because the Motion to Supplement is dispositional in nature, Appellant's inability to incorporate into her brief the requested transcript and testimony effectively denies her a meaningful appeal on the merits.

4. **Necessity of Supplementing the Record:** Denial of the requested supplementation would be highly prejudicial. Appellant’s brief relies upon raw trial evidence already in the record; however, a formal transcription and testimonial foundation—the subjects of the pending motion—were excluded from the record by the very misconduct at the heart of this appeal. Until that motion is adjudged and the record is complete, the Brief remains unsupported and Appellant's due process rights prejudiced.

WHEREFORE, Appellant respectfully requests that the Court grant the requested extension of time and leave to supplement the Record on Appeal to allow for the filing of a substituted, finalized Amended Initial Brief.

Viral Upper Respiratory Illness (Adult)

You have a viral upper respiratory illness (URI), which is another term for the **common cold**. This viral illness is contagious during the first few days. It spreads through the air by the sick person coughing and sneezing. It may also spread by direct contact (touching the sick person and then touching your own eyes, nose, or mouth). Frequent handwashing will lower the risk of spread. Most viral illnesses end within 7 to 10 days with rest and simple home remedies. Sometimes, the illness may last for several weeks. Antibiotics will not kill a virus, and they are generally not prescribed for this condition.

Home care

- If symptoms are severe, rest at home for the first 2 to 3 days or as advised. When you resume activity, don't let yourself get too tired.
- Don't smoke. If you do smoke and need help quitting, talk with your health care provider.
- Avoid secondhand smoke.
- You may use acetaminophen or ibuprofen to control pain and fever unless another medicine was prescribed. If you have chronic liver or kidney disease, talk with your provider before taking these medicines. Also, talk with your provider if you've had a stomach ulcer or digestive bleeding, or if you take blood-thinning medicines. Never give aspirin to anyone under 18 years of age who is ill with a viral infection or fever. It may cause severe liver or brain damage, or even death.
- Your appetite may be poor, so a light diet is okay. Stay well hydrated by drinking 6 to 8 glasses of fluids per day (water, soft drinks, juices, tea, or soup). Extra fluids will help loosen secretions in the nose and lungs.
- Over-the-counter cold medicines will not help you to recover quickly. But they may be helpful for cough, sore throat, and nasal and sinus congestion. If you take prescription medicines, ask your provider or pharmacist which over-the-counter medicines are safe to use. If you have high blood pressure, don't use decongestants without first talking with your provider.

Follow-up care

Follow up with your health care provider, or as advised.

When to seek medical advice

Contact your health care provider right away if any of these occur:

- Cough with lots of colored sputum (mucus)
- Severe headache; face, neck, or ear pain
- Difficulty swallowing due to throat pain
- Fever of 100.4°F (38°C) or higher, or as directed by your provider
