ORDER

On December 2, 2025, Appellant filed the record on appeal. On January 9, 2026, Respondent filed a motion to dismiss, arguing Appellant failed "to timely serve a complete, properly-numbered record on appeal"; alternatively, Respondent seeks for this court to compel Appellant to include all designated items in the record on appeal. Appellant filed a return, opposing the motion to dismiss but asking for fifteen days to make the issues raised by Respondent.

After careful consideration, we deny Respondent's motion to dismiss but grant the alternative requested relief of compelling Appellant to file a record on appeal that includes all matter designated by the parties. Thus, we strike the December 2, 2025 record on appeal. Within fifteen days of the date of this order, Appellant shall serve and file an amended record on appeal that includes all matter designated by the parties and is properly paginated. *See* Rule 210(c), SCACR ("The Record on Appeal shall include all matter designated to be included by any party under Rule 209 and shall comply with the requirements of Rule 267. The Record shall not, however, include matter which was not presented to the lower court or tribunal. Matter contained in the Record on Appeal shall be arranged in the following order: the title page, index, orders, judgments, decrees, decisions, pleadings, transcript, charges, and exhibits and other materials or documents. Each page of the Record on Appeal shall be numbered consecutively beginning with the index."). Failure to comply may result in the dismissal of this appeal.
