Dear Officer of the Court:

Due to the death of Willie R. Anderson and no one being appointed to his estate; we are seeking legal counsel since our previous attorney, Lance Sheek being released by Judge John C. Few, due to Lance Sheek's employment with the Eighth Judicial Solicitor's Office.

I am going to give you a little history about this case: A lady name Ruth Holland married my father knowing he had Alzheimer's, which she kept this information from his family. To make a long story short, she signed him into Laurens NHC, where his stay was to be for six week. My sibling and I went to Ms. Holland and asked her to let us care for him or help her take care of him, she refused. I went to Mr. Sheerer to let him know what was happening. I explained to him that Ms. Holland had spent all of my father's money, (which was over three hundred thousand dollars), and he had no more money and should be released from NHC. Mr. Sheerer told me that he wasn't going to listen to me because my father was crazy and I couldn't take care of him. I, therefore, went before the court. After investigation, they put my father in my care and found that I took better care of him than NHC.

I feel Mr. Sharer, from NHC, used the information that was given to him for the betterment of his business. I believe he was out for revenge because we stayed on them about the improper care of our father. Ms. Holland has several houses and she signs my father into NHC knowing he has no voice in his caring. Now NHC is trying to cover the debt with Mr. Anderson's house which is occupied by his disabled son, who is in a wheelchair and a disabled daughter. This debt would not have existed had things been handled differently.

I spoke with the IRS and they stated that the taxpayer's account is not collectable at this time. This means that Lance Sheek could still be our attorney. At the same time, we are still seeking for a new attorney if nothing changes in the Judge's decision. I ask for the mercy of court.

Please accept my appeal.
