Dear Clerk of Court,

I am the Petitioner-Appellant, appearing *pro se* in the above-referenced Emergency Writ of Mandamus. I am writing to submit the attached Motion to Supplement the Record with critical new evidence and to provide an urgent update on procedural hurdles in the lower court.

1. Motion to Supplement with Judicial Admissions The attached motion includes the Respondent's Answer filed in the lower court on March 5, 2026 (Exhibit N), in which the University admits I was "admitted and registered" for the Spring 2025 term. This admission, combined with digital authentication logs from the University's library servers (Exhibit L), proves that the University's "Never Enrolled" reporting is factually and administratively impossible.

2. Inconsistency in IFP Status Please be advised that despite this Court's prior approval of my Motion to Proceed In Forma Pauperis (IFP), the 5th Judicial Circuit judge denied my IFP application in the related lower court matter today. To ensure my emergency filings were not delayed, I have paid the \$50 motion fees for my lower court Request for Emergency Evidentiary Hearing and motion for leave to supplement the record. I bring this to the Court's attention as it highlights the continued administrative and procedural difficulties I am facing while attempting to correct a record that the Respondent now admits is inaccurate. This IFP denial can harm me if and when a hearing is scheduled because I can not afford the court reporter fees.

In light of these admissions and my passing law school deadlines, I respectfully request that the Court grant the Motion to Supplement and issue an immediate ruling on the Writ of Mandamus.
