Dear Mr. Williams:

This Court is in receipt of your correspondence dated February 23, 2026, stating that you do not intend to order a transcript. However, Rule 207 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR) provides that you, as the appellant, must make satisfactory arrangements (including agreement regarding payment for the transcript), in writing with the court reporter for furnishing the transcript. The rule further provides that unless the parties otherwise agree in writing, you *must* order a transcript of the *entire* proceedings below.

Our records reflect that the time for ordering the transcript in this matter has expired. Within ten (10) days of the date of this letter, you must file a copy of the letter showing that you have timely ordered the transcript from the court reporter. If you have not timely ordered the transcript, you must serve and file a motion requesting permission to order the transcript outside of the filing deadlines set by Rule 207, SCACR, along with a copy of your letter addressed to the court reporter.

You must copy the Court, the Office of Court Administration and opposing counsel with all correspondence concerning the transcript. The address for Court Administration is as follows:

You must advise the Court of the status of the transcript within ten (10) days of the date of this letter, or your appeal will be dismissed.

If you wish for the Court to take action on your February 23, 2026 correspondence, you must file a motion pursuant to Rule 240, SCACR. No further action will be taken on the February 23, 2026 correspondence.
