Dear Counsel:

I am writing to follow up on the October 21 deficiency letter from our Clerk's office.

In that letter the court identified instances in which the documents you filed did not comply with the South Carolina Rules of Appellate Procedure. We have determined that those deficiencies are serious enough that we must dismiss your appeal if they are not corrected. We have already given you ten days to make the corrections. If you fail to correct these deficiencies within ten days of the date of this letter, your appeal will be dismissed. The deficiencies we previously identified were:

- The notice of appeal is not accompanied by the order(s) and/or judgment(s) challenged on appeal.
- The required filing fee has not been submitted. The correct filing fee is \$100.
- A proof of service has not been provided. You must serve and file a proof of service substantially in the format shown by Form 7 in Appendix C to part II of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR). The SCACR are available online at www.sccourts.org/courtReg.

- The document you provided to the Court appears to be your initial brief. Please provide a notice of appeal, an example of which is shown on Form 1 in Appendix C to part II of the SCACR.
