RE: Roman v. PNC Financial Services, Renee Beach, Phillip Beach et. al.
(S.C. Supreme Court - Case No. 2026-000713)

Dear Justices:

I represent Mr. Roman and Gravitas Synergy Solutions, LLC, in the above-referenced matter. Last evening on behalf of these clients I filed a petition, petition exhibits (including supplemental affidavit of Mr. Roman), complaint and proof of service of in support of an emergency petition for writ of injunction in the Court's original jurisdiction. The petition (page 6) and complaint (third cause of action) separately reference the need for temporary or preliminary injunctive relief if the writ is not immediately issued. In a call with the Supreme Court Clerk's office this morning, it was asked of Petitioners to more specifically describe this need for temporary relief to the Court.

As the Court can see from reviewing the Statement of the Case in the petition and seeing, in particular, Exhibit 4, Respondent PNC is currently obligated to produce to the Beach Respondents a response to their subpoena (Exhibit A at 11-14). This legal obligation began upon the filing of the Court of Common Pleas order Monday, March 16. The affidavit of Roman (Exhibit E) provides that we have learned PNC intends to comply with the subpoena and will be doing so imminently, but may not need until Monday, March 23, 2026. The affidavit also provides that if PNC's production occurs, immediate, irreparable harm will come to Mr. Roman, Gravitas Synergy and to the sources of this investigative journalist's reporting. Consequently, we are also requesting a temporary restraining order or preliminary injunction pending the Court's determination of its jurisdiction in this matter and Petitioner's requested relief.
