

## ORDER

---

On March 5, 2026, Appellant filed a motion to unseal all ex parte motions and orders filed in the Horry County Court of General Sessions in connection with Appellant's underlying criminal convictions. According to Appellant, Respondent consents to this motion. After careful consideration, we grant Appellant's motion for the limited purpose of allowing Appellant and Respondent an opportunity to review the sealed documents to determine whether any issue relating to them should be included in the direct appeal. Within ten days of the date of this order, the Horry County Clerk of Court shall unseal the motions and orders and send copies of the sealed motions and orders to Appellant's counsel, either by mail or email, and Appellant's counsel shall allow Respondent's counsel access to the documents. Should either party seek to include any portion of the sealed documents in their designation of matter to be included in the record on appeal, nothing in this order presents any party from filing a motion to seal at that time. Finally, we hold this appeal in abeyance pending Appellant's counsel's receipt of the sealed documents. Appellant's counsel shall immediately inform this court of receipt of the sealed documents to allow this court to reset the briefing schedule.
