APPELLANT'S MOTION TO STAY TIME FOR ORDERING TRANSCRIPT


The Appellant, in the above-captioned matter, hereby moves the Court for an ordering staying the time in which to order the transcript of the lower court proceedings. The grounds for said motion shall be as follows:

1. The Appellant is an indigent party, and has moved the Court to be allowed to proceed in forma pauperis status; and
2. That, according to the rules of this Court, the appeal is subject to dismissal or refusal to docket, upon a finding that the rules of court have not been complied with, including the failure of a party to provide a Record on Appeal, which in the instant case, requires a transcript of the lower court proceedings convened on November 3, 2025 in the Richland County Court of Common Pleas before Judge Daniel Coble on the Appellee's motion to dismiss; and
3. That, as Appellant is indigent, he is unable to afford the costs, fees, and expenses associated with obtaining a transcript of the lower court proceedings, and has filed with this Court a contemporaneous motion to be allowed for protective order and for allowance of costs, fees, and expenses in relation to obtaining the transcript of the lower court proceedings;
4. That, under the above-circumstances, in the interest of justice, and equal access to justice, this Court should grant a stay of the time limits for ordering a transcript, and grant Appellant relief from the requirement to order the transcript in view of his indigent status, and the outstanding motion to be allowed costs, fees, and expenses; and
5. That, this Court has recognized on several occasions the unique hardships encountered by indigent litigants in civil matters, and has created the Commission on Equal Access To Justice, to assist in resolving such hardships. In re Commission on Equal Justice, 417 S.C. 118, (Chief Justice, S. C. Supreme Court, August 10, 2016) Appellant requests those considerations equally apply to the instant appeal.

WHEREFORE, having presented the foregoing matter, Appellant

requests the Court issue an order staying the time to order a transcript, and further grant Appellant relief from the requirement to order same at his own expense, as he is indigent. That, the court stay said time limits, pending disposition of the contemporaneously filed motion filed by Appellant to be allowed costs, fees, and expenses for ordering the transcript of the lower court proceedings.






- January 13, 2025, Letter to Richland County Clerk of Court, requesting the identity and contact information for the court reporter who transcribed the November 3, 2025 hearing before

- judge Daniel Coble; and copy of same was sent to the South Carolina Supreme Court clerk the same date; and
- January 14, 2026, Filed with SOUTH CAROLINA SUPREME COURT, Appellant's Motion For Protective Order and Allowance of Costs, Fees, and Expenses, including provision for costs and fees for provision of the Transcript of the November 3, 2025 Hearing before judge Daniel Coble, and attached Affidavit and Proposed Order granting same; copy served on South Carolina Court Administration c/o Clerk of the Supreme Court, ; no action to dispose of this motion has been forthcoming; and
 - January 16, 2026, mailed to South Carolina Supreme Court, "Appellant's Motion To Stay Time For Ordering Transcript", filed with South Carolina Supreme Court on JANUARY 22, 2026; and copies served to Office of the South Carolina Attorney General and on the South Carolina Court Administration c/o Clerk of the South Carolina Supreme Court; and
